Cottonseed Keep Best At Low Temperatures

Good quality cottonseed can be stored for as long as 15 years with reasonable assurance that it will germinate. But proper conditions of moisture and temperature must be maintained.

C. W. Overman, Chowan County farm agent for the State College Agricultural Extension Service, says U. S. Department of Agriculture scientists have found that two upland varieties of cottonseed, Carolina Dell and Deltapine A, germinated well after being stored 15 years at 83 degrees with seven, nine, and 11 per cent moisture. The same two varieties showed some deterioration when stored at 13 per cent moisture; all seed were dead after 15 years at 14 per cent moisture.

Mr. Overman said seed stored at 70 degrees with seven per cent moisture were 73 per cent capable of germination after 15 years. All lots stored at

70 degrees with more than seven per cent moisture were dead at the end of the 15 year period.

Seeds stored at an uncontrolled air temperature did not survive as well as those stored at a constant temperature of 70 degrees. Only those with a moisture content below seven per cent survived beyond three years, and all lots were dead after 13 1/2 years.

Seeds showed most rapid deterioration, according to Mr. Overman at 90 degrees. Those containing 14 per cent moisture were all dead in four months, and those at all levels of moisture were dead or badly deteriorated in three years.

Moore, chairman of the Rehabilitation Committee in Chowan County, along with Mrs. Sidney McMullan, last week visited the District Tuberculosis Association office in Elizabeth City to observe and talk over some of the ways and means of helping TB patients in and out of the sanatorium in Chowan County, and how the county must depend on volunteers to help with the program.
