Livestock Producers

The 5 per cent loans may be amortized over a 3-year period and secured by the best lien possible on the borrower's property and his personal obligation to repay the borrowed money. Other creditors, although not asked to subordinate their claims, are expected to agree to stand by so the farmer before he had to reduce his herd. Applications Are Avail-to agree to stand by so the farmer can have a fair chance to work out of his difficulties. Agreements are made to let the farmer apply a reasonable part of his livestock income to repay-ing the special livestock loan.


