In Lifetime One of the extraordinary and in-

gorating aspects of American life the mobility of the population as evidenced by the great number of persons who change their homes and places of residence every year. Figures compiled by the U. S. Bur-

eau of the Census from a sample survey show that approximately 20 per cent of the civilian population moved in each year between 1947 and 1952. The number involved exceeded 30 millions in the year between April, 1951 and April, 1952. The majority of these movers stay within the same community or nearby areas but mil-lions move across state lines every year.

A Long Tradition


This mobility has long been characteristic of the American population. As a result, the Census Bureau found that nine out of every ten persons one year old and over in the United States in April of last year had moved at least once in their lifetime, and that only 2 per cent of the adult population can qualify as "old timers" in their particular communities in the sense that they have always lived in their present homes.

Americans come by this mobility restlessness among the first settlers residence in the 1951-52 period. and those who followed them, combined with the search for opportunity and the drive to get ahead, that built up this country and made it the great democratic power it is today.

H.H.-Jacksonville. No, the Motor Vehicle Manual says no one under 16 years of age may also ranked high. be issued an operator's permit. Wait until your 16th birthday, then make application at your nearest State Highway Patrol office for a license. Even so, applicants between 16 and 18 must have their parent's or guardian's consent before a permit can be issued.


70 Per Cent U.S. Land **Area Privately Owned**

Seventy per cent of the land area of the United States is privately owned, primarily by individuals. Included in this percentage is land in farms where the proportion of private ownership amounts to more than 92 per cent.

Individuals (including partnerships and estates) are the predominant landholding class, owning 63 per cent of all the land in the country and just under 88 per cent of the land in farms, according to the U.S. Department of Agriculture. Corporate ownership represents only 7 per cent of the country's land area and less than 4½ per cent of the land in farm.

The Federal Government alone owns more than a fifth of all the land in the United States, about four times as much as is owned by State and lo-

cal governments combined. Over hree-fifths of all public lands are used for grazing purposes under leas-es and permits. Large areas are al-
