Revised Ordinance Will Be Studied By Board Of Health

Members of the District Board of Health will consider, at their next meeting, the problem of the 1953 revised United States Public Health Service milk ordinance and code.

The Board will welcome suggestions from the public whether or not they (the public) would like grade "C" milk legally sold in this health district. The Health Department feels that there is at present an adequate supply of Grade "A" pasteurized milk available. The ordinance can be passed with or without the grade "C" provision.

Interested people should write or call the Health Office in their county giving their opinions.

improved if the State would make this improvement along Route 32. Mr. Byrum was assured that Town Council will cooperate in an effort to have this work done by the State.

Henry G. Quinn and Haywood Phthisic agreed to enter into an agreement with the Town to lease P & Q Super Market property to be used as a public parking area. Under the terms of the agreement the town will maintain the parking area with marle and provide adequate lights.

J. H. Conger made a request to pipe a ditch on the hospital property, but no action was taken.

The idea of extending the town's limits was also considered with a view to properly laying out streets on present undeveloped property, which

is necessary if water, sewer and light lines are to be installed. A committee was appointed to make a survey of conditions and present recommendations at a subsequent meeting. The committee is composed of George Alma Byrum, J. Edwin Buffalop, John Mitchener from Town Council and Ralph Parrish and R. N. Hines from the Board of Public Works.

Complying with a request from the Board of Public Works, Town Council passed a motion to institute a suit against C. B. Mooney to secure title to property at Westover Heights on which a pumping station is located.

The Councilmen rescinded a previous motion to separate a petition for a sidewalk on the north side of East Church Street from Court Street to

the railroad. Some expense will be involved in removing seven trees between Oakum Street and the railroad, so that under the present petition this cost will be distributed among all the property owners in the two blocks instead of the few between Oakum Street and the railroad.

Another request was presented from the Teen Age Club asking for \$150 to pay the supervisor. The Councilmen agreed to go half way and appropriated \$75 of the amount.

At the recommendation of Chief of Police George I. Dail, the Councilmen voted to abolish left turns on Broad Street to Eden Street as well as to entrances to the Belk Tyler and P & Q Super Market parking areas. One way traffic was also authorized

on Armory Street from Hicks to Peterson Streets from 8 A. M., to 4 P. M., on a trial basis.

KIDNEY BEAN RABBIT

2 tablespoons chopped onion
1 green pepper, chopped
2 tablespoons Triangle butter
1 can kidney beans
2 tablespoons C&C catsup

1/2 teaspoon Worcestershire sauce
Salt, pepper, cayenne
1/4 lb. process cheese
toasted crackers

Cook the chopped onion, green pepper and butter in top of double boiler for a few minutes. Add drained kidney beans, catsup, seasonings, and cheese cut into several pieces. Place over hot water and cook slowly until cheese is melted. Serve hot, on freshly toasted crackers. Makes 3 to 4 servings.
