R. Rowe of Raleigh, Mrs. George Warren of Blount's Creek, N. C., and Mrs. Grace Holliday and Mrs. Fannie Prescott, both of Aurora. Fifteen grandchildren and one great grandchild also survive. He was a member of the First Christian Church.

Funeral services will be held on Thursday afternoon at 3 o'clock at the Williford Funeral Home. The Rev. E. C. Alexander, pastor of the Christian Church, will officiate with burial in Beaver Hill Cemetery.
