

Workshops Planned To Attract Industry

C & D Engineers Will Assist Local Groups With Planning

Industrial development workshops designed to help local communities and groups in their industry-seeking efforts will be held in every county of the State this year, according to Director Ben E. Douglas of the Department of Conservation and Development.

Douglas said development engineers from the C&D Department's Commerce and Industry Division will attend each of the workshops to help local groups with their planning for new industries.

Those interested in forming workshop groups in each county are urged to write the Director, Department of Conservation and Development, Raleigh, N. C., and necessary information and assistance will be furnished Douglas said.

Director Douglas said the Department of Conservation and Development is planning to give local communities more assistance in the future in their industry-seeking efforts than it has been able to give in the past.

"We want these development workshops to be real cooperative efforts on the part of local communities and the Department of Conservation and Development in the efforts being made to bring more industrial payrolls into North Carolina and thus help raise the per capita income of North Carolinians," Douglas said.

In the stepped-up efforts to bring more industries into the State, Douglas said the Department of Conservation and Development has added new personnel to its commerce and industry division.

Some Hay Is Desirable When Cows Get Silage

A question frequently asked by North Carolina dairymen is, "If I feed plenty of good quality silage, do my cows still need hay or some dry roughage?"

George Hyatt, in charge of dairy extension work, N. C. State College, says that on the basis of experiments so far, it appears that at least a small amount of hay is desirable—but not absolutely necessary for top milk production.

"When cows are fed top quality corn silage during the winter months and allowed to graze good pasture during the summer, they apparently remain healthy," according to Hyatt. One experiment station has raised cows to several years of age without cured hay—just pasture and corn silage. Another experiment has demonstrated that good production can be maintained by feeding grass silage as the only roughage.

Only a few direct comparisons of milk production from cows fed silage with and without roughage have been made, says Hyatt, but it seems now that further tests will show that additional roughage is not essential.

If a dairyman has adequate quality silage, but limited hay, he should make his hay last longer by feeding small amounts (two to five pounds per day), along with liberal amounts of silage.
