DINNER PARTY STEW
 1 pound NATUR-TENDER or Budget beef—chuck, round or flank steak
 8 tablespoons flour
 1/2 teaspoon salt
 3 medium onions
 Cut meat into thin strips 2 inches long or small cubes. Roll in flour mixed with salt and pepper. Peel and slice onions. Brown meat and onions in hot fat 10 to 15 minutes. Add tomato juice and bouillon cubes that have been dissolved in hot water. Add sugar. Bring to boil, then simmer over low heat 1 1/2 hours or until meat is very tender. Add mushrooms and sour cream. Bring to boil, stirring to blend. Add extra seasoning if necessary. Serve on hot rice. Makes 4 servings.
