

Agricultural Conservation Program Payments Made To 421 Local Farmers

Through Program \$7,433.80 Is Distributed to Chowan Farmers; \$28,040.48 Used In Using Liming Materials on Crops

Through the 1953 Agricultural Conservation Program \$7,433.80 is now being brought into the county through checks to 421 farms, announced W. A. Harrell, Chairman of the Chowan County ASC Committee. Also Mr. Harrell reported that under this program credit for conservation services and materials was received by business concerns in the amount of \$28,040.48. A total of 421 farms in the county were assisted in using liming materials on crops and pastures, fertilizer on pastures, establishing and improving permanent pastures, sowing small grain and sowing winter cover

crops. The lime and fertilizer applied to the soil improved conditions which in turn resulted in an increase in the production of crops and improvements in pasture and forage. Farmers of Chowan County have found that using winter cover crops as a regular practice in their farming system is a sure step to continued production. The intent of the 1953 AC Program was to obtain the greatest possible conservation with available funds, and to assist farmers in increasing conservation activities on their farms.

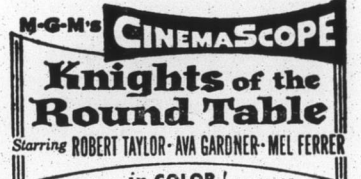

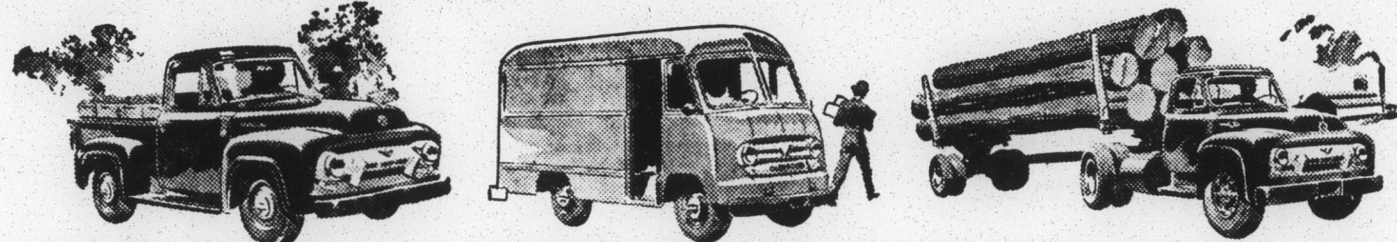

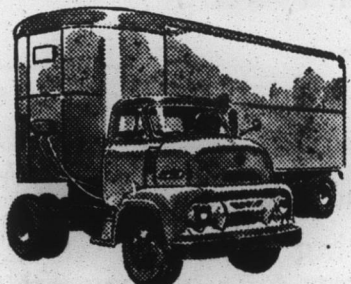
