Friday — Milk, salmon croquettes, cheese squares, cole slaw, mashed potatoes, carrot sticks, corn muffins, butter, jello with fruit.

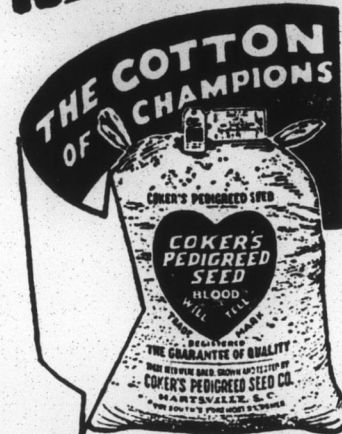

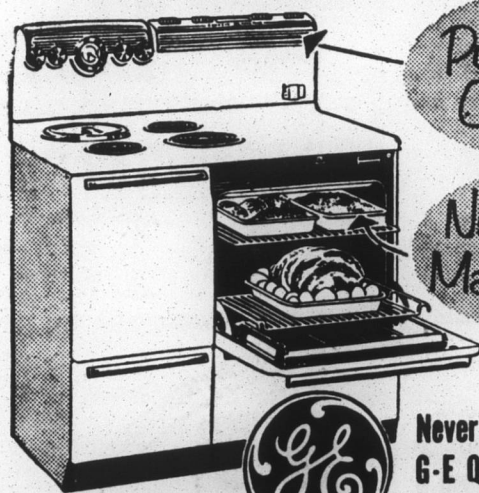
