

## Peanut Growers To Meet On March 26

### Annual Meeting Scheduled to Be Held in Scotland Neck

First annual meeting of the North Carolina Peanut Growers Association will be held in the high school auditorium in Scotland Neck on March 26, at 2:00 P. M., announces J. S. Sugg, executive secretary of the association.

An interesting program to peanut farmers has been prepared for that meeting. Dr. E. T. York, North Carolina State College Research Department, and Mr. Flake Shaw of the North Carolina Farm Bureau will be the two principal speakers.


