where near done; our knowledge nowhere near complete. In our work, the best is yet to be," he said.

The president declared that the Chowan Society seeks to raise \$1,000 this year. "Throughout the nation are centers similar to those located at Greenville and Raleigh which are affiliated with the National Society for the great transformation is only in its Crippled Children and Adults. 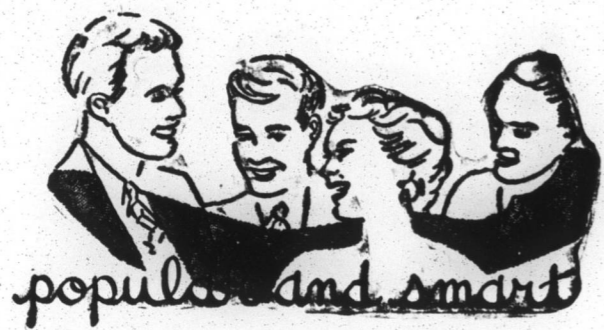
