

## Vaccination Against Rabies This Month

### District Health Officer Urges All Dogs to Be Vaccinated

The District Board of Health at a meeting on March 9th passed a resolution declaring a campaign of vaccination against rabies of all dogs in this Health District beginning in April. State law requires that all dogs be vaccinated when a campaign is being conducted.

"While no rabies has been found in humans or animals locally," says Dr. B. B. McGuire, District Health Officer, "a rabid dog has recently been found in Martin County. Only through vaccination of all dogs in our Health District can we feel comparatively safe from this dreaded and uniformly fatal disease."

Rabies inspectors are Dr. G. L. Gilchrist of Edenton for Chowan County, Professor G. C. Buck of Hertford for Perquimans County, and Dr. Victor Finck for the northern half of Pasquotank and Camden counties and Dr. T. V. Dahl for the southern half of Pasquotank and Camden counties.

"Have your dogs vaccinated to protect yourselves and your children from rabies," says Dr. McGuire. "The rabies inspectors' schedule will be announced soon."

Frequently at these clinics physical defects are found that can be corrected before school opens. The earlier in life defects are corrected, the less permanent damage will result, and the more improvement can be expected to the damage already manifested.

Parents will be welcome at all clinics, but their presence is not necessary. Children can be taken to the clinic by an older child if desired, but at the clinic the child's full name and exact date of birth must be furnished. Dr. McGuire urges friends to tell their neighbors about the clinic, for many times there are some parents who do not know about them.

**SHRIMP REMOULADE**

1 pound raw shrimp  
4 tablespoons olive oil  
2 tablespoons tarragon vinegar  
1 teaspoon salt  
2 tablespoons creole mustard  
Simmer shrimp 8 to 10 minutes in water seasoned with McCormick seafood seasoning, or your favorite seasoning. Drain and cover with cold water at once. Peel. Chill. Make dressing of other ingredients. Mix well. Pour over shrimp and let stand 24 hours in refrigerator. Serve on shredded lettuce as either a first course or main dish.
