Week-end crashes accounted for 15,-800 killed and 800,000 hurt during April 27th, at 2:30 P. M., in the Cho-hostesses. 1953. Forty-one per cent of the deaths and 36 per cent of the injuries occurred on Saturdays and Sundays last

"The Passing Scene" also reports that three out of four 1953 auto accidents happened to passenger cars drivng in clear weather on dry roads.

Eighty per cent of vehicles involved in fatal accidents were traveling

straight ahead. Saturday was the most dangerous

day of the week to drive. 1953 was the fourth consecutive year of increase in the death toll.


