Norfolk TV Station To Increase Power And Change Channel

Colorful Program Planned For Switchover On May 1

With the change of channels for WTAR-TV, Norfolk, on May 1 from Channel 4 to Channel 3, Chowan County will be better served through the increase in tower height and the increase in power.

WTAR-TV's new tower stands 1,029

feet above the ground—Virginia's tallest man-made structure, and 1,049 feet above sea level. The power to transmit the picture will be increased from 24,000 watts to 100,000 watts and the power to transmit the sound will be increased from 12,000 watts to 50,000 watts. These new facilities will serve half a hundred counties in Virginia and North Carolina.

The festivities on May 1, the day of the switchover to Channel 3, will have a very colorful May Day theme. A representative from each of the counties in WTAR-TV's coverage area will vie for the crown of Miss WTAR-TV in a beauty contest to be held during the celebration. A unique feature will be a May Pole dance around the base of WTAR-TV's 1,029-foot tower—the tallest May Pole in history. The dance and many other features will be telecast from the site

of the new tower.
 The lucky young lady who wins the title of Miss WTAR-TV will receive an all-expense three-day stay in New York. She will be accompanied by Mildred Alexander, WTAR's fashion and woman's director. The winner and Mrs. Alexander will stay at the Ambassador Hotel on fashionable Fifth Avenue. The visit will include network television appearances, New York's fashion houses and Broadway shows.

The contestants and their chaperones will stay at the new Hotel Commodore Maury in Norfolk during the celebration. All of the contestants will appear on WTAR-TV's "Variety Show" Friday afternoon, April 30, at 4:05 P. M.
