Edenton's National Guard Unit Praised For Care Equipment

Superior Rating Given At Inspection Held Last Week

Edenton's Heavy Mortar Company of the North Carolina National Guard on Friday was given a Third Army technical inspection which was conducted by Captain R. L. Elzer and five non-commissioned officers from the 82nd Airborne Division, Lieut-Col. Walter C. Sharp, the unit's advisor, was also present during the inspection.

The inspection included all of the equipment of the company and will be interesting to know that a superior rating was given on ordnance equipment, engineer equipment, quartermaster equipment, signal equipment, chemical equipment and medical equipment.

Captain Cecil Fry, commanding officer of the Edenton unit, was congratulated for the outstanding performance of the unit in maintenance of equipment.

The Edenton company is now at top strength with 83 enlisted men, one warrant officer and three officers. Recruiting has been so successful throughout North Carolina in recent months that no more enlistments will be accepted until July 1. There are now about 8,000 National Guardsmen in North Carolina.
