

### Inclement Weather Halts Band Parade Starting Pool Fund

### Jesse Harrell Asks For Generous Contributions For Project

Due to inclement weather, the Edenton High School Band was unable to parade as planned for the "kick-off" drive to raise funds for the erection of the swimming pool in Edenton Tuesday. However, canvassers for the campaign got off to a good start as soon as the rain slowed up.

Jesse Harrell, president of Hicks Memorial Swimming Pool, Inc., stated that a thermometer has been placed on the corner of The Bank of Edenton, so that all may see how the fund campaign is progressing. He issued an urgent appeal to the citizens of Edenton and the county to give generously so that the goal of \$25,000, may be reached, and construction of the pool can get underway immediately. A large sign has been posted between the Edenton Armory and Park Avenue, which designates the site where the pool will be built.

Harrell announced that at a meeting of the Varsity Club Monday night he was presented a check for \$250 from the organization as a contribution toward the pool. He also announced that the up and coming "Lighthouse Club," composed of pupils of the first grade, have donated \$2.00 toward the project.

"I am sure every one wants to have a part in the construction of this worthwhile project," Harrell said, "so let's get busy and push that thermometer way over the top and let the kids enjoy the pool this summer. If any persons are missed during the campaign this week, don't let this hold up your much needed contributions, just send your check to Mrs. Cecil Fry, treasurer, or to me, payable to Hicks Memorial Swimming Pool."

 2 pounds Colonial Natur-Tender or Budget round steak (cut ½ inch thick)  
 2 tablespoons shortening  
 1 teaspoon salt  
 ¼ teaspoon paprika  
 1 clove garlic  
 1 cup water  
 1 cup sour cream  
 1 teaspoon paprika  
 2 tablespoons flour  
 ½ cup cold water  
 Melt shortening in skillet. Rub meat with salt and paprika. Brown garlic in hot shortening. Remove garlic. Add the meat, and brown well. Add water and worcestershire sauce. Cover and cook 2 hours. Add sour cream and the 1 teaspoon paprika. Cook 15 minutes. Remove steak to platter. Combine flour with cold water, add to broth; cook until thickened. Serve gravy over the steak.
