Fined For Evading Unemployment Law

Johnnie Ward, 224 East Church Street, was tried before Justice of the Peace F. W. Hobbs Tuesday night on charges of attempting to evade the Employment Security Law. He was found guilty and sentenced to 10 days in jail, suspended upon payment of a fine of \$10 and costs of the action.

When Ward filed a claim for unemployment benefits at the local Employ-

ment office for the week ending April 7, 1954, he certified that he had worked and earned \$8.00, whereas he had worked for the Edenton Fish Company and earned \$26.50 for that week.

There are further penalties which accompany such convictions. Not only is a claimant ineligible for benefits during the remainder of his benefit year, but any benefits received after the commission of the fraud must be repaid before he is entitled to any future benefits.

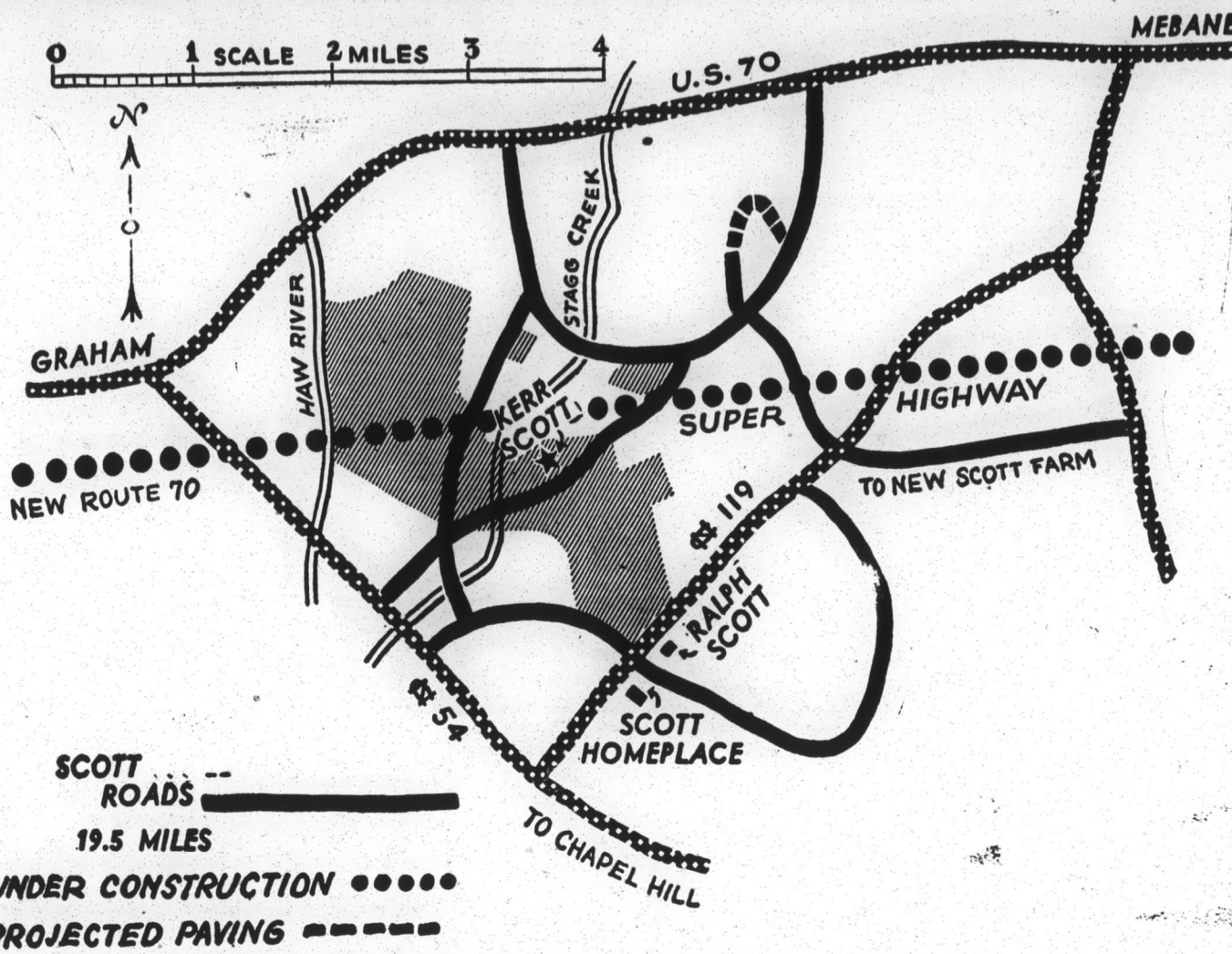
