(Continued on Page 6, Section One) X-ray program is an economical method to find tuberculosis, cancer of chest cavity and enlarged heart. Each discovery of tuberculosis in apparently healthy people will lead to earlier treatment greatly increasing the chance of cure; a shorter period of treatment, saving in hospitalization costs; less loss of time from work; less danger of family being in economic distress; breaking chain of infection in family groups and in community at large.

Early diagnosis of lung cancer and enlarged heart leads to earlier treatment and lengthens life.

The District Health Department, the Board of County Commissioners of all four counties, the District Tuberculosis Association, and the N. C. State Board of Health are providing personnel, equipment, educational materials, and funds to make this program possible.
