## **Cost Of Government From 1789 Is Nearing** Trillion Dollar Mark, 82% Of This Since 1940

Military expenditures (including military aid to our allies)-\$506 billions, or 57 per cent of the total. Interest on the public debt-\$76 bil-

Bulk of Spending Since 1940 All but a relatively small fraction of these tremendous costs were incurred in the last decade and a half as the result of American leadership in the fight against the menace of totalitarianism; and it has made economy in Government one of the great is-

Federal expenditures for the decade of the Forties and the 1950-53 fiscal years added together amounted to \$730 billions in all, or 82 per cent of all Government outlays in the 1789-1953 period. This total, however, has fallen far short of expenditures, and the current public debt is around \$270 billions as a result. The predominant cause of both deficits and debt has been war, both "hot" and "cold".

By far the biggest single source of Government revenue has been the income tax on individuals and corporations. In the four decades of its existence since the adoption of the 16th Amendment, the income tax has produced \$440 billions of Federal revenues through the 1953 fiscal year, or more than two-thirds of all net Government budget receipts for the 1789-1953 period as a whole.

Past Trends and Now

There was a repetition of this development after World War I. The Twenties were a period consistent annual budget surpluses despite tax cuts, and the public debt was reduced by more than a third from its wartime peak by the end of the decade. Again economic expansion in the period was an important contributing influence.

The figures show, however, that military expenditures always fell sharply after past wars. These outlays in the Twenties, for example,, represented little more than a quarter of all Government spending for the period, or about half the rate in the previous decade. This time the situation is different. Right now defense costs, including military assistance abroad, are running around two-thirds of the entire Federal budget. That is why in this period of crisis the Government must watch every dollar of its spending, and economize wherever burden is to be avoided.




