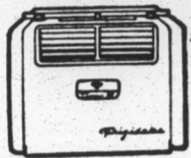

**DELMARVELOUS BROILED CHICKEN**  
(Winning recipe, National Chicken Cooking Contest, Salisbury, Md.)

2 to 2 1/2 pounds Natur-Tender broiling or frying chicken  
1 lemon  
1/2 cup malted Triangle Butter  
1 teaspoon salt  
1 teaspoon sugar  
1/2 teaspoon paprika  
1/2 teaspoon black pepper

Have chicken split in half for broiling. Rub entire surface of chicken with cut lemon, squeezing lemon to obtain plenty of juice. Coat with melted butter. Sprinkle with mixture of salt, sugar, paprika and pepper. Place in broiler pan, skin side down. Place broiler 5 to 7 inches from source of heat. Chicken should broil slowly. Adjust heat so chicken just begins to brown lightly in 10 minutes. Turn and brush with butter two or three times during broiling to brown and cook evenly. Total cooking time varies from 25 to 30 minutes. The chicken is done when the meat in the thickest part of the drumstick cuts easily and there is no pink color visible. Serve with pan dripping poured over top.
