It maintains, or aids, 158 leprosy colonies in 38 countries on five continents in cooperation with 62 Protestant denominational and inter-denominational mission boards. Its pur pose is to carry on an educational program to dispel the public dread of leprosy and to stimulate interest in the role of Christian Missions in leprosy work over the world.
