The reel type mower depends on a sharp cutting edge whereas the rotary type depends on a mulching action of the cutter bar to trim the grass. The rotary type mower is usually provided with a guard, but due to its construction a space must be provided between the blade and the ground. This necessary space makes it possible for stones, sticks, and other debris to be picked up and thrown out with great force.

This clearance space also provider an opportunity for the foot or shoe to enter into the whirling blades and Holley, Janie May Lee. a score of serious cuts have been reported to the Accident Prevention Section of the State Board of Health.

The reel type mower operates at a slower rate of speed and may be equipped with a guard or catcher to prevent the throwing out of stones and sticks. The user should be particularly careful to avoid adjusting the blade while the motor is running.
