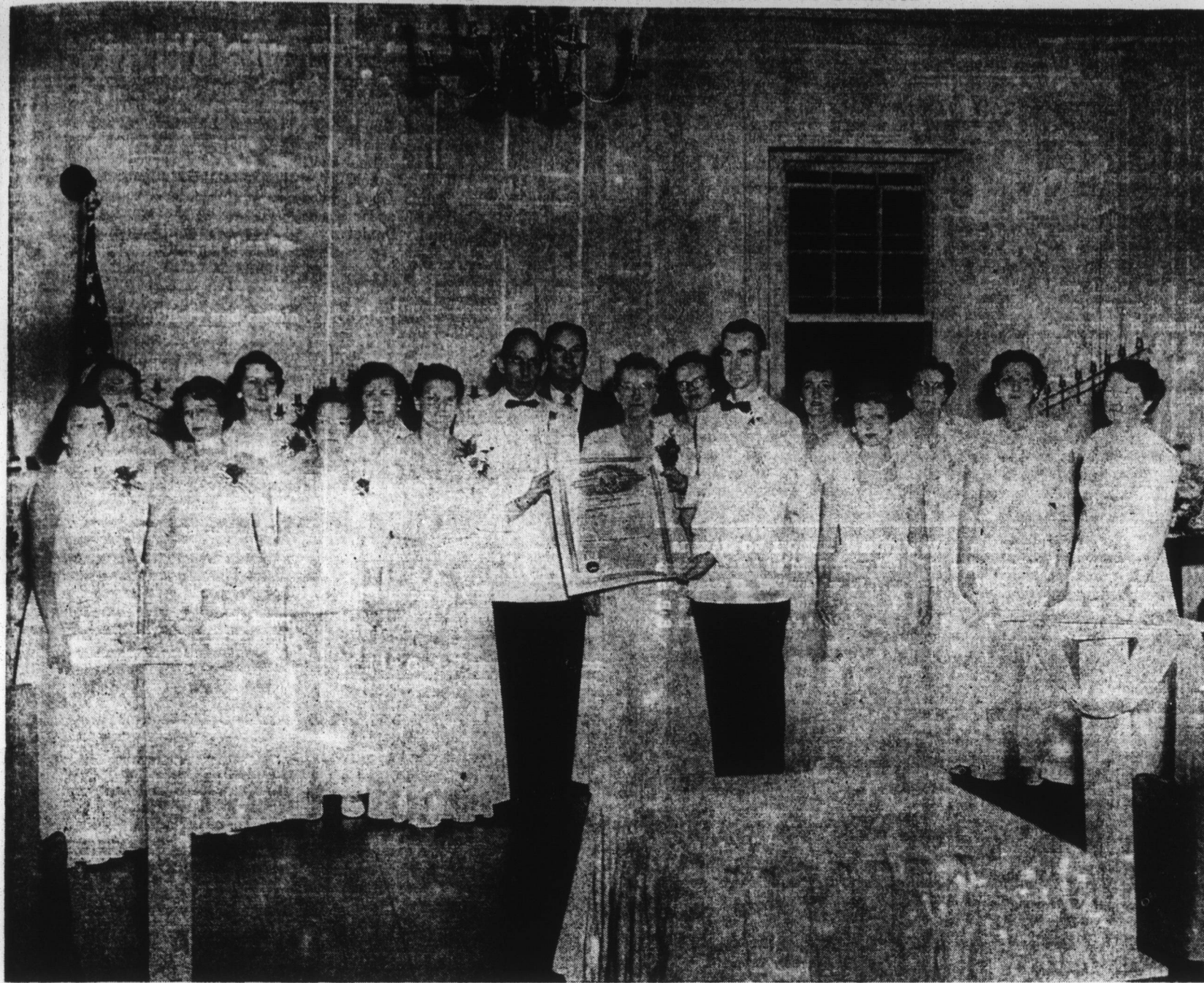


Edenton Chapter of Eastern Star Receives Charter

Delegates To Attend Watchtower Assembly

Four delegates and interested persons from the Edenton area are preparing to attend a Watchtower District Assembly of Jehovah's Witnesses in Richmond, Va., June 24-27.

R. P. Long, congregational supervisor, described the assembly as a "huge-scale four-day seminar of Bible discourses, forums and dramatized discussions designed both for public consumption and for the training and advancement of public ministry of Jehovah's witnesses."

An official estimate of 10,000 people are expected at the assembly, he announced.

J. W. Davis, Jr., circuit representative for the witnesses throughout Eastern North Carolina, will have charge of the opening session Thursday morning, June 24, at 9:30 o'clock, when he will deliver a discourse, "speeding up the Flight to the Mountains" Sunday morning of the assembly.

Food Umbrella Aids Summer Picnickers

A new gadget has been devised to aid summer picnickers.

Called a "shoo-fly food umbrella," it is designed to protect picnic or outdoor dinner tables. The clever food cover, said to be a perfect foil against bugs and flies, is 16 inches square. It fits down over cakes, pies, sandwiches, and other foods.

Made of gaily colored cotton net reinforced with wire ribs, the cover folds up like an umbrella and can be tucked in a picnic basket along with the lunch.

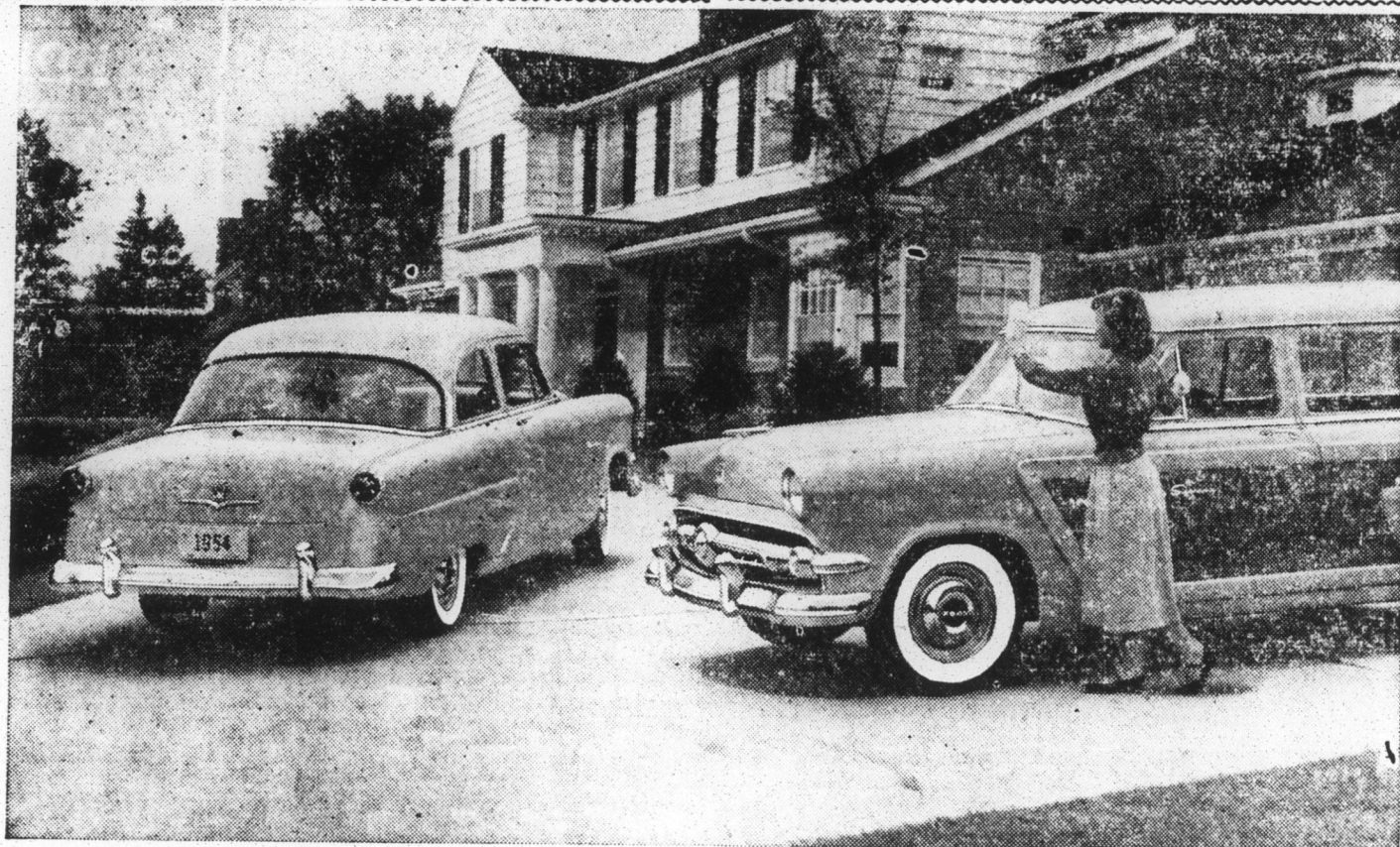

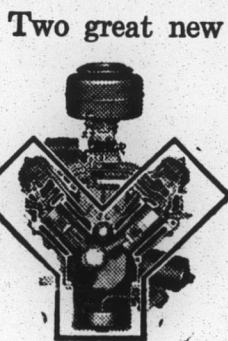

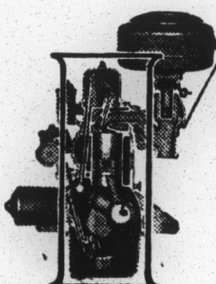
