**Cotton Survey Shows Very Few Boll Weevils**

Generally, very few boll weevils are in the cotton fields so far in Chowan County, says C. W. Overman, County Agent. Eleven fields, spotted over the county, were surveyed Monday. One hundred plants over each field were examined.

The counts were as follows: Advance, Woodrow Lowe, none; Enterprise, Lloyd Bunch, none; Edenton, Edward Speight, none; Rocky Hook, Ralph Dale, none; Cross Roads, A. M. Forehand, none; Gliden, J. D. Ward, nine (near gin) and McCoy Spivey, none; Ryland, T. L. Ward, one; Center Hill, Tom Asbell, none.

Many fields are beginning to square but generally, cotton is small. Growers should watch their fields carefully each week and when weevils begin to appear dusting should be started. "Generally, there is no need to start dusting yet," says Mr. Overman. "We will try to give you a news article each week so watch for it."

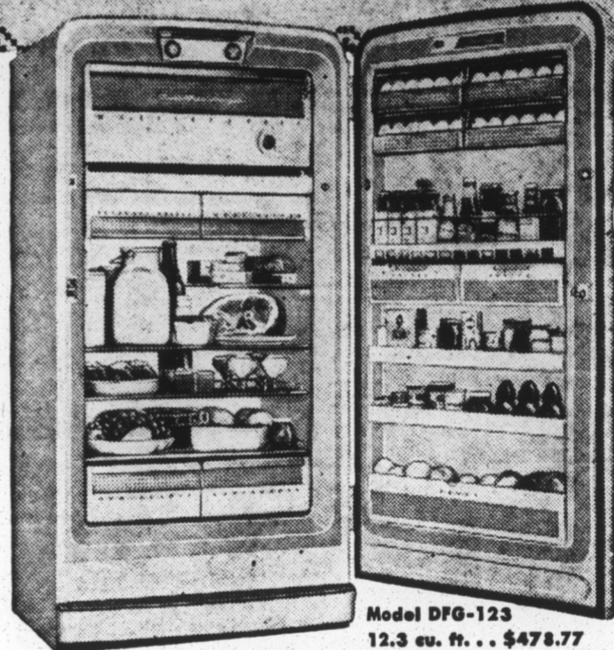

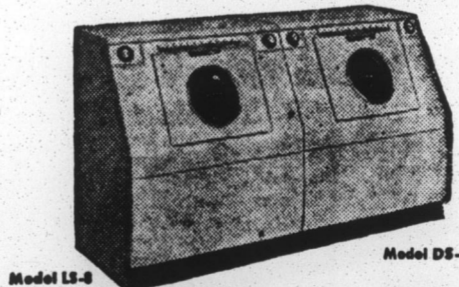

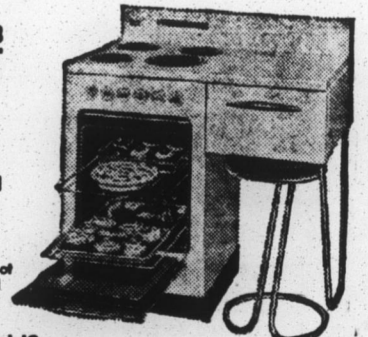
