This better understanding is particularly needed in order that they, as citizens in a democracy, may help to determine governmental policies and create a public opinion which will promote economic strength and prosperity. It should also be particularly useful in counteracting communist propaganda. Among this year's participants are school supervisors and principals, school librarians, and teachers on all educational levels.

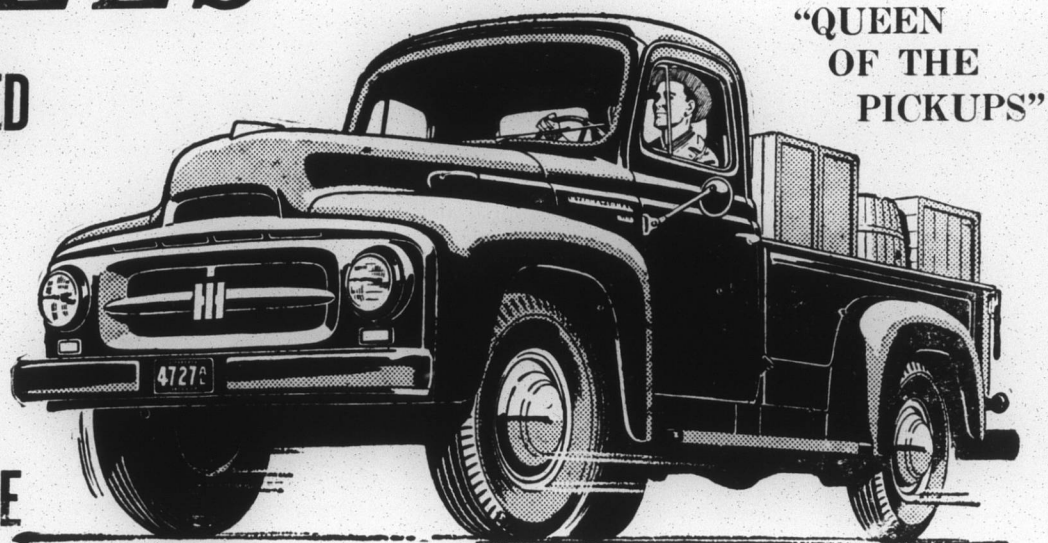
