Above is pictured some of Edenton's firemen fighting one of the most disastrous Edenton fires which broke out at the W. E. Malone's 5 and 10-cent store in the heart of the business section of Edenton. Firemen are fighting the fire at the rear of the building, where it mysteriously started near the elevator shaft. The store was gutted and merchandise and fixtures were a complete loss, estimated to be \$30,000, not including damage to the building. Smoke also did considerable additional damage to merchandise in the Elliott Company clothing store, and while the Hughes Parker Hardware Store was filled with smoke, not so much damage was done. 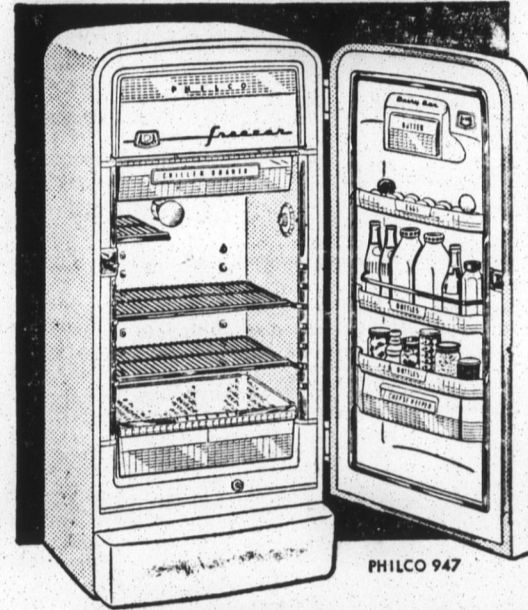

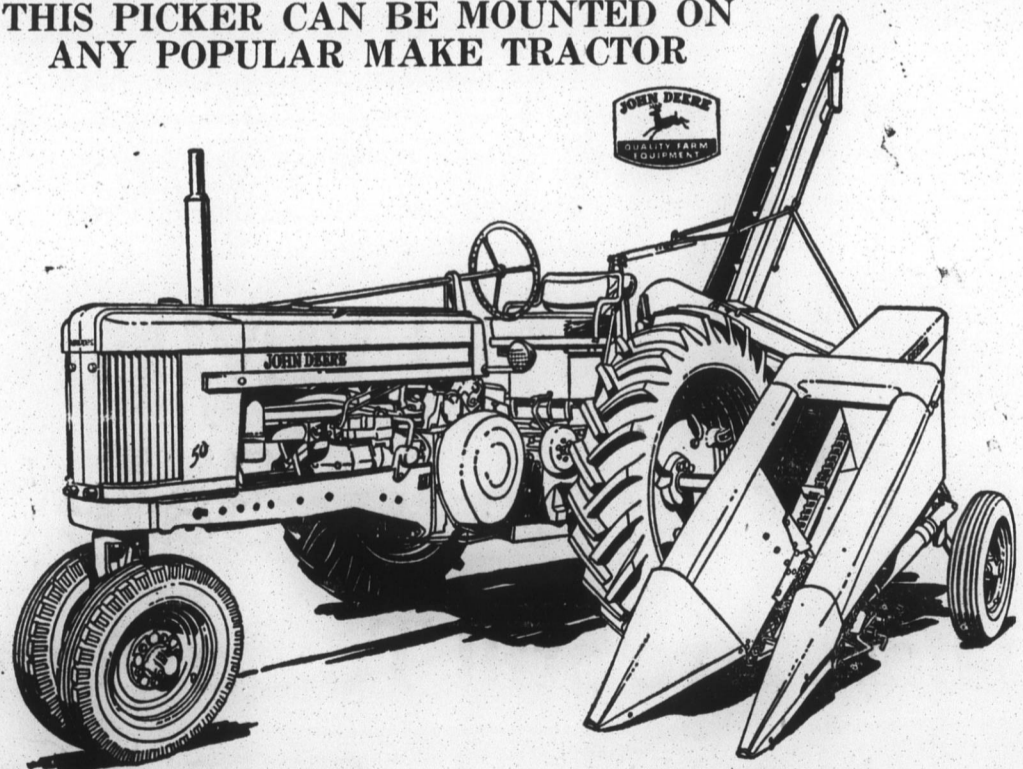
