## **Record Crowds See Lost Colony Drama**

Rainy Weather Has Set Back Attendance By 4,000 Persons

Before the current week ends more than 30,000 persons will have paid to see Paul Green's symphonic drama The Lost Colony, now in its 14th season at Waterside Theatre at Manteo on Roanoke Island, N. C. This pushes the total for the 14 seasons to approximately 680,000 paying customers. The Lost Colony is America's longest-lived outdoor production.

Written by Pulitzer Prize Winner Paul Green and shown first in 1937 the spacious drama, presented on multi-level stages in a great amphitheatre at Fort Raleigh, actual site of the original happenings in the story the play tells, has been presented each summer since 1947, except during four World War II years when the show had to be closed as a coastal blackout security measure.

The story Paul Green's internationally famous drama tells is built up around attempts by Sir Walter Raleigh to establish the first colony in the New World. It also tells, in song, dance, pantomine and the spoken word of the events back in Elizabethan England of the 16th Century when plans were being laid to extend the British Empire to new lands, how the "New World" discovered by Captains Amadas and Barlowe was named "Virginia" in honor of the then ruling British Queen Elizabeth, and of Virginia Dare, the first child of English Virginia, is already on the increase. parentage born in the New World.
