

Albemarle Sound Claims Three Lives Sunday Afternoon

Small Motorboat Capsized Near Mouth of Mackeys Creek

Albemarle Sound claimed three lives late Sunday afternoon when a party of four in a small outboard motorboat capsized at the mouth of Mackeys Creek about a mile from shore. In the party were Mr. and Mrs. Pat Respass, their two-year-old daughter and Edward Ellis, a friend of the family.

Mr. Respass was rescued while clinging to the overturned boat, but the other three were drowned.

According to C. J. Belch, who operates a herring plant at Mackeys, the party went out in the water which was rather rough at the time and as their boat circled a buoy, water washed over the side and it was swamped.

Screams from the child are said to have attracted attention to the plight of the party and Sonny Davenport of Roper went to the scene and rescued Respass. No trace of the others was seen.

A number of boats joined in the search, but due to darkness and an impending thunderstorm, none were recovered Sunday night.

However, the bodies of Mrs. Respass and Ellis were found about 11 o'clock Monday morning, but up until Tuesday the child's body had not been located.

High Prices Reported To Clean Septic Tanks


K. J. Eyer, sanitarian for the District Health Department, reports that recent complaints have been received about persons cleaning septic tanks and charging an enormous price for their services.

The septic tank law adopted over a year ago requires persons so employed to secure permits from the Health Department. Even though these permits are secured, the Health Department has no control over the prices paid for this service. It has been reported such fly-by-night operators tell the property owner they work for the Health Department, and were sent to clean their tanks. This means of approach is absolutely not true.

Persons are warned to have such services performed by a reputable person or company. However, if some transient worker is engaged, the price should be thoroughly agreed upon before work is started.


