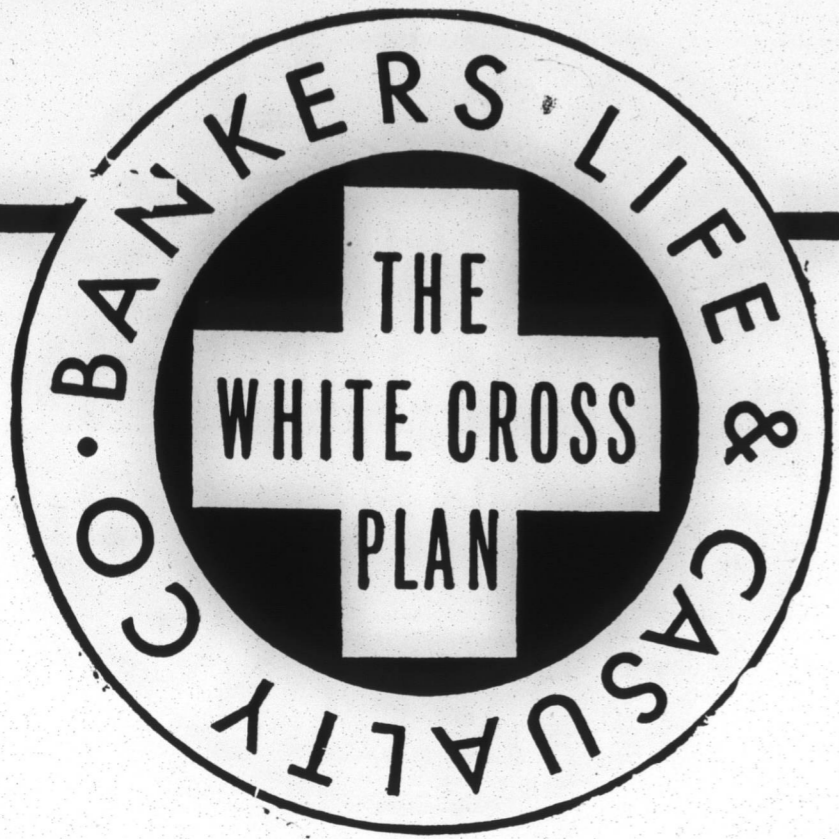

### Minutes Of County Board Of Education

The County Board of Education held its regular meeting September 7 at 10 A. M., in the office of the Superintendent. The following members were present: J. I. Boyce, G. E. Nixon, Conroy Perry, D. H. Berryman, Carey Evans, G. B. Potter, chairman.

The meeting was called to order by the chairman by having the secretary read the minutes of the previous meeting. The minutes of August were read and adopted by a motion made and passed.

The election of Ralph A. Spainhour by the District Committee was approved by a motion made and passed.

The reports of the county treasurer and the local school fund treasurer were presented, and adopted by a motion made and passed.

The luncheon contract with the North Carolina Department of Agriculture was presented and same adopted by a motion made and passed.

A motion was made and passed to join the North Carolina School Board Association by paying the membership fee for Board of Education members and that of the District Committee in the amount of \$40.00.

The Superintendent stated that the stoker for the Chowan High School gymnasium had been delivered, but not yet installed.

The Superintendent reported that according to all reports on the cotton picking situation indicated that September 15th through September 28th would be a suitable period for the White Oak Consolidated School to close for picking cotton in that area. This opinion was concurred in by the Board members.

The need for additional typewriters for Chowan High School was expressed by the Superintendent, and he was authorized by motion made and passed to obtain eight additional typewriters.

The plans and specifications for four more class rooms, library, boiler room and storage room were presented by the architect, Frank W. Benton. It was voted by a motion made and passed to authorize that these be presented to the State Board of

Education for final approval, and that bids on same, after approval, be advertised, and that the date for opening of same be September 28th at 2 P. M., in the office of the Superintendent.

The matter of building a reservoir at Chowan High School in the rear of the building was discussed. It was thought that a dragline could be used for excavation and a pool of water would be available at all times for fire fighting purposes, and as a result, might decrease the cost of insurance on school property. It was the opinion of Board members that the cost of providing this reserve of water would not be excessive. The project is to be considered at a later meeting.

The bills paid since last meeting in the amount of \$4,112.00 were approved upon a motion made and passed:

Current expense, \$1,751.41; veterans program, \$635.55; teacherage fund, \$324.60; capital outlay, \$1,400.44; total, \$4,112.00.

There being no further business, the Board adjourned.

## 2,478 Prosecuted For Speeding In August

### Violations In General Down Somewhat From Year Ago

Speeding took a heavy toll of Tar Heel drivers in August the Motor Vehicles Department reports as 2,478 motorists faced prosecution for exceeding the speed limit.

And for the first time this year reckless driving offenses were exceeded by failing to stop for a stop sign. Reckless driving, with 492 cases, normally is in third place in the monthly summary. However the vehicles agency reported 498 stop sign violations which took over third place. Driving without an operator's permit held second place with 822 arrests in August.

Violations, in general, were down somewhat from August of last year.

Other violations as reported in the summary included faulty equipment 468, improper passing 275, driving on wrong side of road 215, following too closely 157, and failing to give right of way 119.

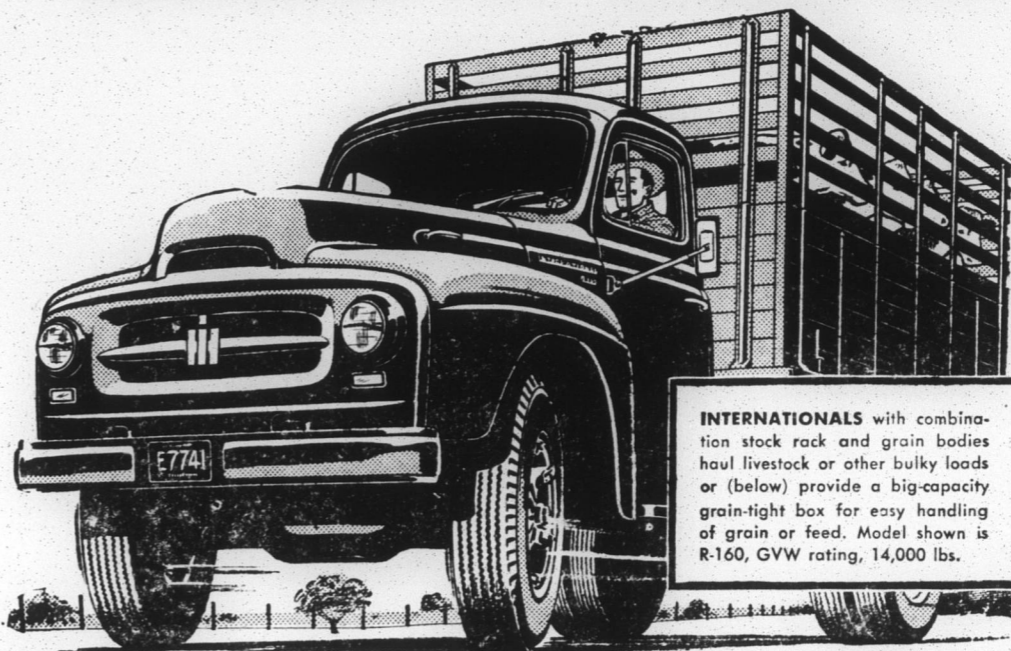
The month's total of Tar Heel offenders came to 5,889 with 1,405 out of staters added to the list.

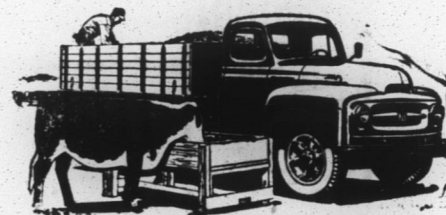
