

2,478 Prosecuted For **Speeding In August**

Violations In General Down Somewhat From Year Ago

Speeding took a heavy toll of Tar Heel drivers in August the Motor Vehicles Department reports as 2,478 motorists faced prosecution for ex-

And for the first time this year reckless driving offenses were exceeded by failing to stop for a stop sign. Reckless driving, with 492 cases, normally is in third place in the monthly summary. However the vehicles agency reported 498 stop sign violations which took over third place. Driving without an operator's permit held second place with 822 arrests in August.

Violations, in general, were down somewhat from August of last year. Other violations as reported in the summary included faulty equipment






