Senator Sam Ervin and Judge Susie Sharpe To Speak on Program

U. S. Senator Sam J. Ervin, Jr., of Morganton and Superior Court Judge Susie Sharpe of Reidsville will be featured speakers at the fall meeting of the Eastern North Carolina Press Association in Fayetteville November 5 and 6.

The Fayetteville Observer will be host to the group and has planned a tour of the Fort Bragg reservation beginning at 2 P. M., Friday, November 5. Visiting newspaper folk will be shown among other things new atomic weapons at the Fort.

The banquet will be in the Camellia Room of the hotel Friday night with Senator Ervin as the speaker. Mrs. E. F. McCulloch of the Bladen Journal, Elizabethtown, president of the association, will preside.

Panel discussions will feature the Saturday morning session. Henry A. Dennis, editor of the Henderson Dispatch, will lead a panel on "Nonsegregation and the News." Boy Gray, editor of the host Fayetteville Observer, will lead a panel on "Radio, TV and the Press."

The luncheon Saturday will feature an address by Judge Sharpe, the only woman Superior Court judge in North Carolina. Officers for the next year also will be elected at the luncheon.

Irvin Blanchard of Gliden community planted one stack row each of NC-1 and NC-2 peanut varieties in comparison with the Jumbo Runner. Observation this week indicated very little stem rot disease in the field and all varieties are looking very good. The NC-1 and NC-2 varieties have made excellent growth and indicate a good crop.

Mr. Blanchard plans to keep accurate yields on the three varieties and results will be given at a later date.

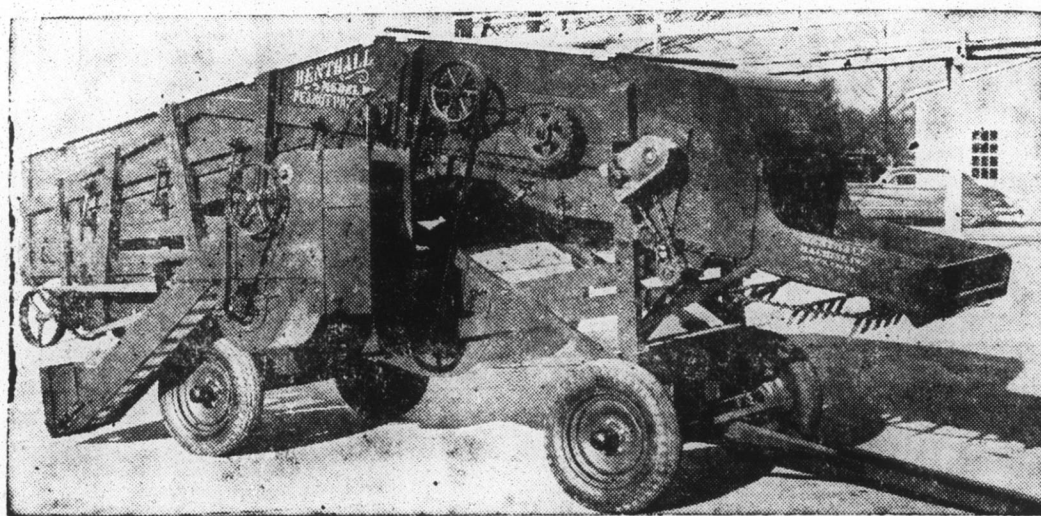

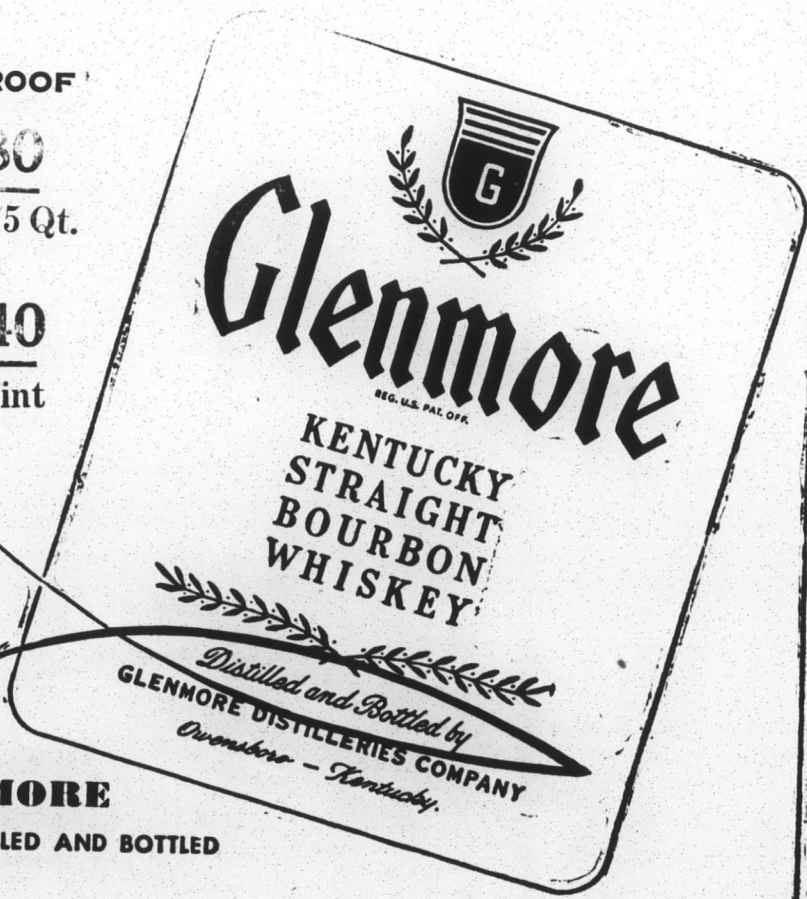
