County Forest Ranger White Calls Attention **To Securing Permits**

The dry weather being experienced at the present time in Chowan County has resulted in dangerous burning conditions that make it unsafe to burn material near the woods where there is a possibility of it escaping County Ranger Frank White has announced.

A number of fires have resulted from careless burning of corn cobs, corn shucks and bull dozier piles in this area during the past few days. Anyone planning to do any burning of any Music Class Honors kind should secure a permit and take all of the necessary precautions to keep the fire from escaping into the woods. Special care should be taken now as a result of the dry conditions.

County Ranger White wishes to remind everyone that effective October 1, a permit must be secured before Edwards family will soon leave Edenof a wooded area during the hours of ton due to Mr. Edwards being transmidnight and 4 P. M. Fires can be ferred to another church at the started without a permit between 4 nual Methodist Conference being held P. M., and midnight. The permit law does not apply to any burning done within 100 feet of an occupied dwelling house.

The N. C. Division of Forestry personnel hope that everyone will take the proper precautions and keep their fires under control so that it will not be necessary to cancel all burning permits and prohibit the starting of any fires in or near any woodland. A dry fall was experienced last year but it was not necessary to stop issuing permits because most of the burning was kept under control. The same will be true this year if the number of fires escaping from fields is kept to a minimum, and the weather does not become critically dry.

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
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




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
