

Edenton Aces Lose Hard Fought Game To Ahoskie 19 To 13

Breaks of Game Prove Very Costly to Edenton Gridders

Although outplaying the Ahoskie Indians Friday night in an Albemarle Conference game played in Ahoskie, Edenton's Aces were victims of the breaks of the game and lost a heart-breaker by a score of 19 to 13. The Aces chalked up 10 first downs to four for Ahoskie. In the passing department the Aces completed four out of 10 passes for 52 yards, while Ahoskie netted 70 yards on the only pass completed in four tries. Ahoskie was penalized 80 yards and the Aces lost 50 yards on penalties.

Ahoskie scored shortly after the kickoff when Hall slipped through the entire Edenton team at the 48-yard line to score the first touchdown. The try for the extra point failed. Shortly afterward the Aces began a drive from their own 35. At the 8-yard line Holland flipped a pass to Rogerson for the Aces' first touchdown. Rogerson's kick for extra point was good, so that the Aces were out in front 7-6.

The Aces' lead didn't last long, for

a few minutes later Hall threw a pass which was good for 70 yards. This play was a lucky break for Ahoskie, for Jimmy Harrison jumped up to break up the pass and the ball glided into the hands of Hill, who raced for a touchdown without being touched. The try for the extra point was good putting Ahoskie in the lead 13-7. Shortly before the half ended Whitson's kick was blocked so that Ahoskie had possession of the ball on the Edenton 8-yard line. In two plays the Indians scored their third touchdown, but the try for the extra point failed, so that the score at half time was Ahoskie 19, Edenton 7.

The Aces came back strong in the second half but were able to score only one more touchdown. Edenton recovered an Ahoskie fumble on the Ahoskie 47. Holland's pass to Wright was good for 17 yards and in two plays Stilly added 22 yards, putting the ball on the 8-yard line. Holland then called a pass play but not seeing an open target, he plunged through the line to score. Rogerson's kick was wide, so that the score was 19-13. With an exchange of punts neither team could gain much ground during the remainder of the game, but Ahoskie had an edge in that Hall made some beautiful kicks to keep the Aces out of Ahoskie territory. The loss dropped the Aces from the Albemarle Conference Championship race.

The game attracted a large number of Ahoskie and Edenton fans with the Rogerson's kick for extra point was good, so that the Aces were out in front 7-6.

130 Chowan Persons Get Old Age Assistance

During October 130 persons in Chowan County received old age assistance with \$3,285 being distributed. Twelve aid to dependent children cases received \$491, while 11 aid to blind cases received \$406 and 14 aid to permanently and totally disabled persons received \$492. Five cases received \$49.40 for general assistance, while \$234 went for five cases hospitalized in the county and \$35.13 for two cases hospitalized outside the county.

Service cases included one person receiving veterans rehabilitation in cooperation with the Department of Public Welfare, one person receiving free eye examination through the N. C. State Commission for the Blind, five child labor certificates issued and 11 children receiving individual service.
