per acre have been reported. Four weeks ago the stem rot disease was very prevalent causing considerable damage on many farms. Growers were wearing rather long faces, stating that the peanuts were ruined, but the damage turned out to be much less than expected.

In the Cross Roads community J. E. Baker and Colon Forehand reported yields of almost 35 bags per acre averaging around 83 to 85 pounds per bag. The grade is good. In the Gliden community several




