Similarly there was little change in the proportions of harvested cropland. Cotton represented 12 per cent, tobacco 11 per cent, lespedeza 10 per cent peanuts three per cent, wheat six per cent and sovbeans four per cent in 1952 and 1953. Corn at 31 per cent and oats at seven per cent were up only one percentage point as compared with 1952.

Total tobacco and peanut acreages declined in 1953. Tobacco acreage at 648,636 was down about 56,000 acres from 1952. A drop of nearly 14,000 acres brought the total for peanuts down to 184,694 acres.

Cotton was harvested from 788 131 neres, a gain of 28,412 over the 1952 harvested acreage. The 2,209,373 acres of corn reported in 1953 represented a very slight increase over th previous year.





