Nothing happens. She doesn't give it a second thought, but tries again, confident that the car will serve her as usual. After three more tries, she realizes with a sinking feeling that she is without transportation. The car will not start, not even with choking. It's absolutely "dead."

CHECK BATTERY
To avoid Betty's dismay on a freezing morning, be sure your battery is in good condition at the beginning of the winter. Have your garage or service station test it to see if it will take and hold a full charge, and discharge at the proper rate for a quick start. If not, replace it now, not later, after it has let you down.

MUST BE THE BATTERY
"Must be the battery," she groans, and remembers that it was a bit hesitant yesterday afternoon. So she must call a taxi instead.

Has this ever happened to you? It has to me. I know of nothing more hopeless than a car that won't run, especially when you are counting on it to get you to an appointment on time.

In Betty's case, this situation could have been avoided. She should have had the battery carefully checked in the fall to see if it would take the strain of winter driving.

The battery of your car is less efficient in winter because the chemical action by which it generates electricity slows as the weather becomes colder. (When

Question: Why is it best to thin soil beneath a basementless transplant perennial flowers in building, has proved to be a cheap, early autumn?

Answer: Soon after leaf fall in reducing "crabgrass" dampness, autumn there is a period of active which frequently leads to decay of growth which continues until the subfloor timbers.

Question: Should sink-type garage be divided and replanted, the large ones? If installed in plants will suffer less setback and soil from home's equipment better performance next to driveway timbers?
