

### Soldiers' Favorite Drink Is Revealed

#### 3,000,000 Gallons Consumed In Month By One Division

SEOUL—The soldier's favorite drink, Hollywood notwithstanding, is water.

Statistics show that the U. S. Army's 24th Infantry Division men use more than 3,000,000 (M) gallons of purified water each month.

There is plenty of water in the area where the Third Logistical division is located, but the troops won't touch a drop of it until the Third Engineer Combat Battalion has purified it. Battalion water points supply more than 100 tank trucks daily from 7 A. M. until 8 P. M.

Water usually is taken from deep wells rather than from running streams which are likely to be polluted. It is passed through sets of filters consisting of sand treated with silver powder which eliminates up to 99 per cent of the bacteria.

Next, the water enters a tank in which six to ten parts of chlorine per 1,000,000 (M) gallons of water is added. Thirty minutes later the water, safe for drinking, may be dispensed.

### Vets' Question Box

To give information to post-Korean veterans and their families on eligibility for education and training under the Korean GI Bill, the Veterans Administration furnished a series of questions and answers, as follows:

Q—Just what is the education and training program of the Korean GI Bill?

A—It is a program of furnishing financial aid for schooling and training to eligible veterans who served after June 27, 1950, the date of the outbreak of the Korean conflict.

Q—Who is eligible for training?

A—A veteran is eligible if he meets all of these requirements: (1) a discharge or release from service under conditions other than dishonorable; (2) honorably discharged after June 27, 1950, and before the date of the present emergency; and (3) at least 30 days total service in the armed forces.

red sooner for an actual service-incurred disability.

Q—Must a veteran have served in Korea to be eligible for the training benefits?

A—No. He may have served in the armed forces any place in the world—in the United States, on a ship—and not necessarily in Korea.

Q—Are there any kinds of military service that do not count in figuring whether a veteran has enough service to qualify?

A—Two types of service do not count: time spent in civilian school, studying courses offered to civilians and time spent as a volunteer in the National Reserve of the Selected Reserve.

Q—Assume that a veteran meets all the requirements for training. May he enroll under the Korean GI Bill even though he has gone back to active duty and is in uniform?

A—No. Veterans are not eligible for Korean GI Bill training while on active duty, even though they meet all the basic requirements.
