Nobody living can do good fly casting with mismatched rod and line. About 99 times in 100, the troubled fly caster has a line much too light to bring out the action of his rod. Clerks in tackle stores are largely to blame for this, according to Jason Lucas, angling editor of Sports Afield magazine. They usually recommend lines too light, almost never too heavy, and still more rarely, the right size. As a matter of fact, most rod makers, in their catalogs, recommend lines too light for the best and easiest casting with their rods.

On any given rod, you should use the same size line for anything from small trout and bluegills up to the largest sea fish—you use the one line that will do

chain-stitched seams, removing the labels and laundering the material. Preparing other cotton bags for sewing is a simple process, the Council says. Chain-stitched seams rip out in a jiffy when corner threads are clipped. Band labels or trade names printed in washout inks, come off easily when the containers are soaked in water.




