The doctors in those days did not have the adequate pharmaceutical preparation, or the skilled druggists as now, but compounded and dispensed their own medicines. The favorite prescription here in those days for the malarial fevers was "half pint Chamomile tea every morning on an empty stomach." Quinine was unknown to the world then, though the Peruvian Bark had been introduced ne time by the Jesuits. Dr. Dickinson was a distinguished physician and was often called in consultation to Norfolk and met his death from exposure in crossing the sound to see some member of the Armstead family.
