c. Cooperates with group leader.

d. Knows the purpose of the group.

e. Is fair about the time he consumes in the group discussions.

f. Accepts and follows through with his assignment.

g. Blends his ideas with other people's.

5. Responsibility of the group as a whole.

a. Accepts assignment.

b. Performs tasks on schedule.

c. Hears each other's views.

d. Analyzes and assesses all aspects of the problem.

e. Submits progress reports to other groups.

f. Sets limit on itself and defines its work.
