(Continued from Page One) able to pay this bill which amounted to \$51.04, so that it was paid from Chowan County Chapter funds. Aside from this bill, it was necessary to purchase a double upright short leg brace and posterior ankle stops at a cost of \$28.50. Because of this treatment, the little girl is now making satisfactory progress.

One-half of the March of Dimes money collected in Chowan County remains in the local treasury to be used for paying for treatment of polio victims when families are unable to pay, to the end that no victim of infantile paralysis will be forced to go without treatment because of lack of finances.

The campaign in North Carolina opened Monday of this week and will be in progress during the entire month of January. Palmer G. Laughridge, Jr., of Salisbury is state chairman, who says thousands of volunteer workers are being mobilized by county March of

Dimes directors. Mr. Laughridge says the 1955 March of Dimes is the greatest challenge since the National Foundation for Infantile Paralysis was formed 16 years ago. "At this time when we have real reasons for believing that polio will be wiped out," he says, "we need to redouble our efforts to raise the funds needed to see the work through to final victory."

Pointing out that "in a few areas in the state some confusion has developed in the minds of the public about the way in which the Foundation puts on its March of Dimes drive," Laughridge emphasized that "in no instance does the March of Dimes enter into any federated or joint fund raising effort. The March of Dimes, as in all years past, appeals to the public to give independently and voluntarily. We are convinced by our own experience that the success of our program depends upon going directly to the people for support."

127 In Chowan Benefit By Old Age Assistance

According to the December report of Mrs. J. H. McMullan, superintendent of public welfare, 127 persons in Chowan County received \$3,234 in way of old age assistance during December. Twelve cases of aid to dependent children received \$481, 11 cases of blind aid received 408 and 14 cases of permanent and totally disabled received \$492. For general assistance, three families received \$59.82, while other financial assistance included four cases hospitalized in the county, \$76.50; two cases hospitalized outside the county, \$33.60 and medicine for one person, \$3.25. Service cases included one person receiving veterans rehabilitation in cooperation with the Department of Public Welfare, three persons receiving free examination through the N. C. State Commission for the Blind, four child labor certificates issued, 11 children receiving individual service and 47 families referred for Christmas service.

COMPLETES COLLEGE WORK—Richard Skinner Hoskins was among the 71 students to complete their work at the end of the fall quarter in November at East Carolina College, Greenville.
