

State Has 20,000 Miles Highways Well Centerlined

14,231.1 Miles Painted Last Year, Engineer Reports

The State Highway Commission painted 14,237.1 miles of white centerline on North Carolina highways last year. Traffic Engineer Robert A. Burch reports. Much of the work was repainting lines rubbed off by traffic or on roads which had been resurfaced.

At least 6,000 miles of usable centerlines did not require repainting last year. So with the 14,237.1 miles painted last year, the State now has approximately 20,000 miles of well-centered highways. Another 6,552.3 miles of yellow warning or "no passing" lines were placed along many miles of the 14,237.1 miles of white centerlines. Yellow lines are placed where the sight distance for a motorist is 500 feet or less. Burch stressed that placing the yellow line is strictly for the driver's safety. It warns the driver to stay in his right lane and that it's dangerous to pull over into the left passing lane. He urged motorists to take advantage of the yellow warning line and not run the risk of an accident by crossing it.

Burch said it takes about 6.15 gallons to paint one mile of highway. Last year a total of 180,847 gallons of paint were used in centerlining. The paint is manufactured in the paint plant of the Prisons Industries at Central Prison. For greater night visibility, the paint is premixed with reflective pointed beads which shine at night. A reflectorized centerline adds safety to night driving.

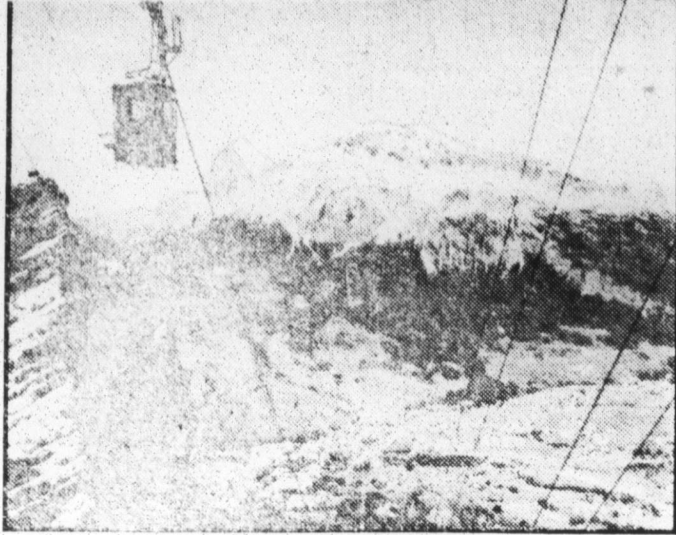

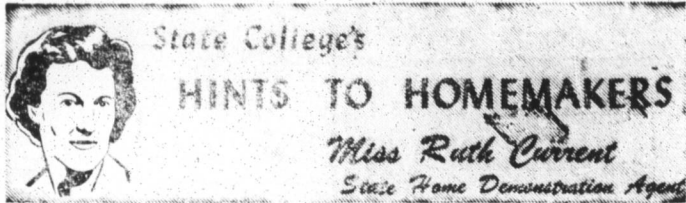

Meat Loaf, Casseroles and Creamed Dishes—Try using creamed soups in meat loaf, casseroles, potato, mushroom, or oyster. There are other creamed soups on the market that will add variety to meat loaf. I'll leave the experimenting up to you and your imagination.

You'll find creamed soups a snap to prepare when you try the new method with condensed soups. The sauce, "Foods that add interest and flavor to casseroles are chopped nuts, chestnuts, Brazil nuts, walnuts, almonds, chopped green peas, peas, strips of pineapple, sliced olives. For good casseroles, use creamed soups, crushed potatoes, or crushed potato cells.

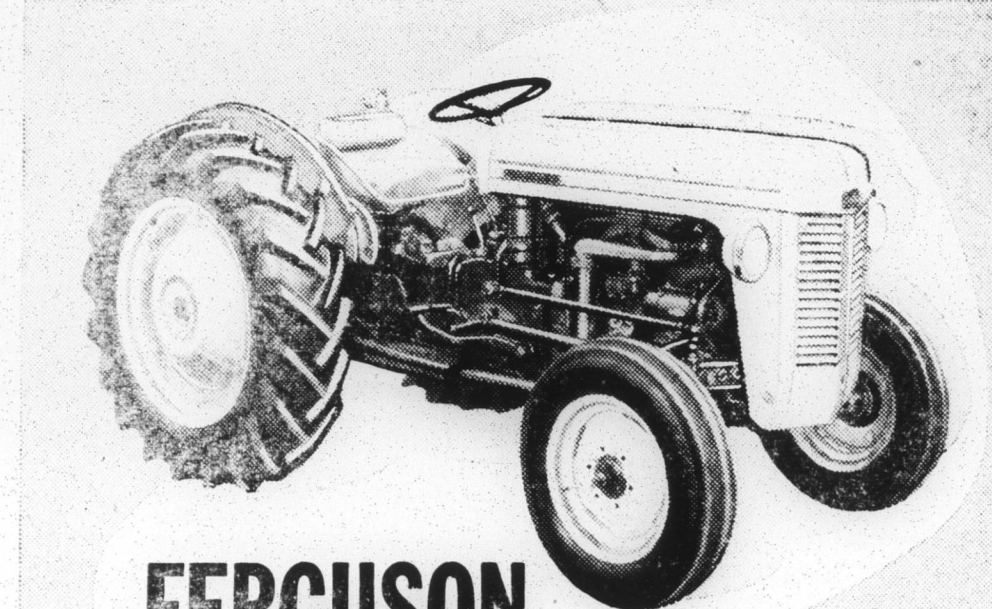

Livestock Needs Dental Check-ups

Livestock, too, can have a toothache once in awhile, the American Foundation for Animal Health has warned farmers.

"Like human beings, animals need their teeth examined occasionally if the rest of their bodily functions are to perform efficiently," a Foundation spokesman says. Quantity and quality of rations are important, but it is equally vital for the animal to chew and shred this food so it can be digested properly.

Dental troubles in meat-producing animals are of three principal types. They include difficulties associated with erupting or shedding of teeth; injuries sustained from biting on hard objects; and anatomical irregularities such as misshaped jaws, unopposed teeth, and more teeth than normal. Symptoms of dental difficulties
