

## Lions Briefed On Reorganization Of Edenton Cub Pack

### Club Rehearsing For Annual Minstrel In April

An inspirational boost was given the movement now under way by the Edenton Lions Club before the reorganization of a Cub Pack, when motion pictures with sound track were shown at the Monday evening meeting of the club by Ray Heck, field representative of Scouting in the Albemarle District.

The pictures portrayed in a most interesting manner the activities of both Boy Scouting and the Cub Pack program, including the 10 steps to be taken in the organization as well as the fundamentals for which this great movement stands.

Explaining that Cub Scouting comprises primarily boys in the age group of 8 to 10 years, Heck stated that the organization is built largely around adult volunteers such as Pack Leader, Den Mother and Scoutmaster. "It is designed as good citizenship in the making. Moreover, it brings back the youthful attitude on the part of the mothers and dads of these boys," said Heck.

Al Phillips, chairman of the committee, stated that his organization has a potential list of 121 prospective members of the Cub Pack, of which 85 boys reside in Edenton and 36 from the outlying section of the county.

Program Chairman J. P. Partin thanked both Heck and Phillips for the splendid program, and expressed confidence that their efforts will achieve great success.

Rehearsals are being held each Monday night for the projected Lions minstrel, which will be staged during the latter part of April, it was announced by West Byrum, Jr., who is directing the show this year. The exact date for the show will be released later.

The proceeds from the sale of Easter Seals has now reached the sum of \$631.00, it was announced by Jesse Harrell, chairman of the campaign.

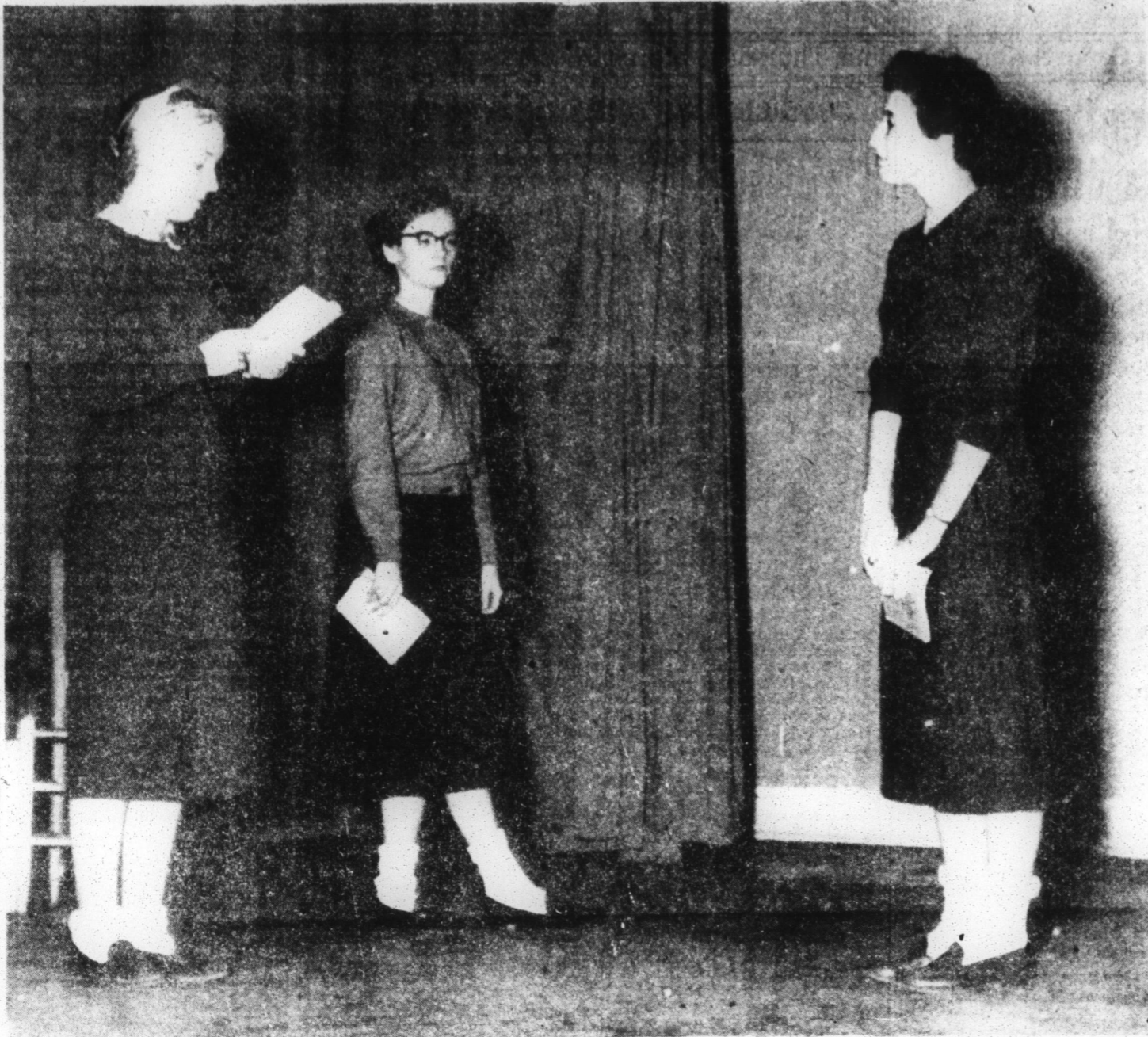

A person can buy a half or quarter of a steer, or a freezer unit, and have beef at a very reasonable price. If you are interested in buying a whole steer or only one quarter, you should get in touch with any members of the Jaycees or the county agents' office.

## Pre-School Clinics Will Begin April 4th

### Schedule Is Announced For Schools In Chowan County

The District Health Department announces the schedule of pre-school clinics for the four county health unit.

Due to the expectant polio vaccination campaign which, if given, will run close to the end of school, the Health Department urges all practicing physicians in the district to help with the pre-school examinations in as many schools as they can. The physicians will be contacted by the nurses before the clinics.

Where the school superintendents and principals and parents want it given, the Health Department will be prepared at the clinics to give a booster dose of triple vaccine and smallpox vaccination for children who have no scar.

At least one parent should be present at the examination, but their presence is not essential. A two week interval is allowed, April 25th through May 9th, in order to get the polio vaccination started in case it is released by the National Institute of Health.

The schedule for pre-school clinics in Chowan County follows:

- Chowan High School—April 4 at 9 A. M.
- Edenton—April 5 at 9 A. M.
- Rocky Hook—April 6 at 9 A. M.
- St. Johns—April 6 at 10 A. M.
- White Oak—April 7 at 9 A. M.
- Edenton Colored School (boys)—April 14 at 9 A. M.
- Edenton Colored School (girls)—April 15 at 9 A. M.
