 services for crippled children and adults. The remainder is used to finance the nationwide program of the National Society for Crippled Children and Adults in areas of education, research and direct services as well as the Easter Seal Research Foundation. Outstanding counselors and consultants at national headquarters help local Easter Seal Society develop their programs.
 Q-How does the Society determine which children are to be served?
 A-Parents are urged to apply for services for their crippled children whenever they are needed.

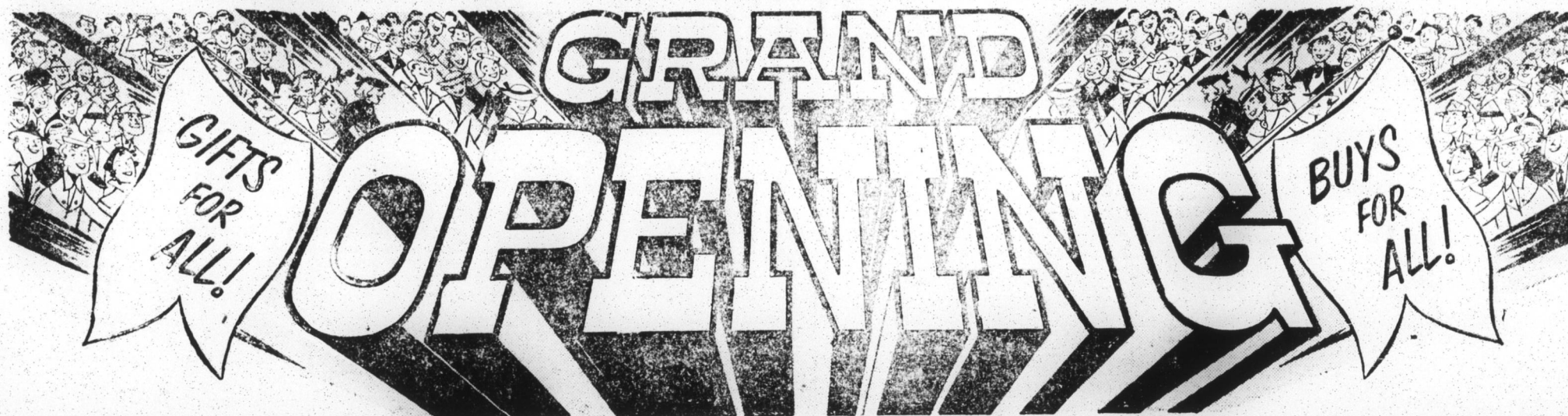
Other agencies and individuals such as doctors, nurses and clergymen are encouraged to refer crippled children and adults for help.
 Q-Who determines the Easter Seal policy?
 A-Volunteers form the basic structure of the Easter Seal Societies. Volunteers serve as members of boards and committees of the Chowan County Society. They include: G. B. Potter, chairman; W. J. Taylor, secretary; Jesse Harrell, treasurer, and Ernest Ward, Jr., publicity director.
 Q-Do qualified professional workers provide the services which children and adults receive at Easter Seal centers?
 A-Yes. Professional staff members employed by the North Carolina Society. All Easter Seal pro-

grams are planned and directed by liaison officers and counselors representing every medical specialty and related fields. The Easter Seal Society actually helps train competent personnel in specialized work for the crippled by providing scholarships, fellowship and grants.

 6. Persistent, loose feces or rough.
 7. Any variation from normal bowel habits.

One arresting fact is that only 5 per cent of lung cancer cases are cured, when 50 per cent could be cured, if its existence were known in time. 35 per cent of breast cancer cases are cured; 70 per cent could be cured. Cures of uterine cancer total 30 per cent, when 70 per cent could be cured. 35 per cent of mouth cancer is cured, but 65 per cent could be cured. 85 per cent of skin cancer is cured when 95 per cent could be cured.
 These figures show why early diagnosis is so vital, why the Society's educational program is so necessary. Cancer strikes without mercy, and it is up to every one of us to see that it does not strike fatally.
 "Please give generously," is Mrs. Reeves' appeal.

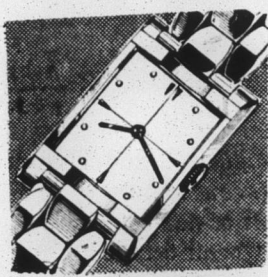

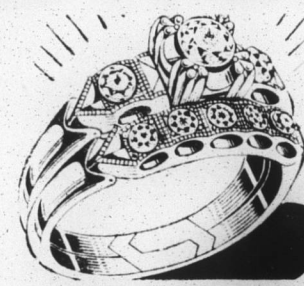
