In a clear, concise and forceful manner, Mike graphically described world conditions and explained the various functions of the United Nations in its efforts to insure peace throughout a troubled world.

"Of all the important departments and committees, the Security Council ranks first and the General Assembly second. However, the Russian delegates have utilized the veto extensively in preventing several democratic nations from becoming members of the organization," said Malone. "However, under similar conditions, it holds forth greater possibilities for maintaining peace than of its predecessor, the League of Nations," continued the speaker.

President Earl Harrell expressed the appreciation of the club for the splendid address.

Young Malone, son of Mr. and Mrs. W. E. Malone, captured the coveted role of valedictorian in this, his senior year at the local high school, having attained an average of 97. He has also been awarded a scholarship at Duke University where he will enter next fall and plans to study for the ministry.

The club voted to begin its summer schedule of meetings on Monday evening, June 6 and to meet only on the first and third Monday nights in each month during June, July and August.
