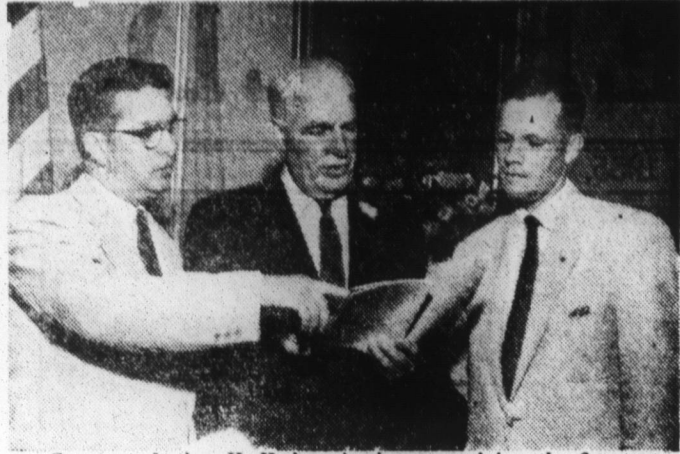

Insects Damaging Cotton In Chowan

Red Spiders, Boll Weevils and Boll Worms Are Found

The cotton insect situation in Chowan County as of August 1 is beginning to look somewhat complicated. Boll weevils, boll worms, and red spiders were found in several fields, according to County Agent C. W. Overman. Fields that have been regularly dusted for boll weevil are showing practically no infestation, from 0 to 3 per cent punctured squares. However, boll worms are just beginning to appear and red spiders are invading the fields.

"Dusting with 1 or 2 per cent Parathion, 15 to 20 pounds per acre will do a good job of controlling red spiders," says Mr. Overman. "Ten pounds of 2 per cent per acre is sufficient. Twenty per cent Toxaphene and 40 per cent sulfur known as 20-40 will not control a moderate to heavy infestation of red spider. This mixture when

used throughout the dusting season will greatly help in preventing red spider infestation and that is its purpose.

"To combat boll weevil and boll worm with lone dusting mixture, use the combined dust containing

2 1/2% Aldrin and 5 per cent DDT at the rate of 15 to 20 pounds per acre. Otherwise, to control boll worm use 10 per cent DDT dust at the rate of 15 to 20 pounds per acre.

The boll weevil, boll worm and

the red spider can do considerable damage to cotton during the next 2 or 3 weeks unless controlled. Growers should keep this in mind, watch their fields carefully, and dust for the next two weeks if needed. Red Spider infestation now

will damage cotton severely. Red Spider infestation appearing the last of August and early in September may be welcomed as they will cause the plants to shed their leaves allowing the sun to enter and open the cotton well."

Drain peaches, saving syrup. There should be 1 cup syrup. If not, add water, then heat to boiling. Remove from heat. Add gelatin and stir until dissolved. Chill until slightly thicker than unbeaten egg whites. Dice peaches into 2-qt. bowl. Add cake and marshmallows. Put ice cold milk into a cold quart bowl. Whip until fluffy. Add lemon juice and whip until stiff. Gradually whip in chilled gelatin. Fold into peach mixture. Chill until firm.
