

U.S. Saving Bonds Sales In Chowan \$24,293 In October 85% of Year's Quota

Purchased Up to **October 31**

For the past ten consecutive months, sales of United States Sav. ings Bonds, Series E & H, in North Carolina have shown a substantial increase over the preceding months of the past years.

October sales amounted to \$4,-503,629.00 which is an increase of 27% over October 1954. Sales for 1955 through October amounted to \$45,955,037.25, which is 78% of the annual quota and 21% greater than last year for the same period. Twenty counties in the State

have already achieved 100% or more of their annual quota, while the State has an excellent opportunity of achieving its annual quo-

"This year's outstanding sales record reveals the growing popularity of United States Savings Bonds in North Carolina," said W. H. Andrews, Jr., Volunteer Chairman for the State.

This report, released by A. Boyd Harless, Chowan County Chairman, shows that Chowan County sales for October were \$24,293.75. The county's sales of \$24,293.75

for October represent \$4,293.75 for E Bonds and \$20,000 for H Bonds. The county's cumulative sales from January 1 to October 31 amount to \$148,600. Chowan's quota for the Negro Achievement year is \$174,900, so that 85 per cent of the quota has been purchased up to October 31.


