A Planning Board zoning ordinance was presented at the meeting and John Mitchener and J. Edwin Buflap were appointed a committee to study the ordinance and bring back recommendations at the next meeting.

The purpose of the Planning Board is to make careful and comprehensive surveys and studies of present conditions and future growth of the Municipality and with due regard to its relation to neighborhood territory. The plan shall be made with the general purpose of guiding and accomplishing a coordinated, adjusted and harmonious development of the Municipality and its environs which will, in accordance with present and future needs, best promote health, safety, morals, order, convenience, prosperity and general welfare, as well as efficiency and economy in the process of development, including, among other things, adequate provisions for traffic, the promotion of safety from fire and other dangers, adequate provision for light and air, the promotion of the healthful and convenient distribution of population, the promotion of good civic design and arrangement, wise and efficient expenditure of public funds and the adequate provision of public utilities and other public requirements.

A discussion of personnel policy for the town was continued until the next meeting.

During the meeting bids were opened for a car for the Police Department and a truck for the Street Department. Byrum Implement & Truck Company was low bidder for an International truck for \$1,800. The BBH Motor Company was low bidder for a Chevrolet for the Police Department at \$1,432.75, allowing \$800 on the old car.

Due to the complications of an insurance program for the town, it was decided to hold a special meeting Friday night, August 24 to consider this matter.

A request was made to pass an ordinance prohibiting fishing from the Johnson bridge, but due to this bridge being private property, the Councilmen took no action. The request was made in the interest of safety, the chances being that somebody might be injured by

passing automobiles.

Charlie L. Downing was granted a permit to operate a taxicab for Wilford Jordan.

Mr. and Mrs. Robert S. Loy were granted a permit to canvass homes in Edenton to solicit subscriptions to a parents' magazine on condition that no objection is registered.

Mildred Wills' requested Town Council to reconsider her application to sell beer at 147 East Gale Street, but she thus far has not presented to Chief of Police George I. Dail a petition signed by residents of the neighborhood to the effect that they do not object.

Stop signs were authorized to be placed at the intersection of Cabarrus Street and Park Avenue and Third Street and Badham Road.
