considerable portion of the meeting, which remained in session until almost midnight, was a request from the Board of Public Works for Town Council to set in motion necessary machinery that will make funds available to obtain temporary permits and time schedule approved by the State Stream Polution Committee.

In order to correct deficiencies in the Edenton water distribution sysem and provide for Town growth consulting engineers employed by the Board of Public Works recommends an expenditure of \$324,000. In addition to alleviate unsanitary conditions in the Edenton Bay \$667,000 must be spent on a sewage disposal plant.

Total expenditures of \$991,000 were recommended by the engineers and of this amount to barely meet State Sanitation Laws and low water pressure \$125,000 must be spent during the next twelve months on the water system and \$405,000 on the sewage disposal

Outlays are more than expected and it will be necessary for the Town Council to appropriate funds for the E & W Board as provided under the charter. Funds can be raised by a bond issue or by tax anticipation notes.

Haste is necessary as steel costs are gradually increasing and the few contractors interested in such projects are becoming few. Each day's delay adds to the essential mmediate outlay of \$530,300.

The Councilmen took no action, preferring to hold a joint meeting with the Board of Public Works in order to more fully consider the proposed improvements.
