

September's U. S. Savings Bonds Sale In Chowan Is \$2,000

Accumulative Sales In County For Year Total \$83,281.25

During September sales of U. S. Savings Bonds in Chowan County amounted to \$2,000 with cumulative sales for the year totaling \$83,281.25, according to A. B. Harless, Savings Bonds volunteer chairman for Chowan County.

During September sales of E and H Savings Bonds in North Carolina were \$3,332,062.25, making a nine months total of \$39,480,440.75 for the calendar year. This compared with \$41,451,408.25 sold during the same period last year.

Sales of Series E Bonds through September show an increase of one-half of one per cent over last year; however the overall decrease of E and H Bonds combined sales is less than 5 per cent from a year ago.

The Series H Bonds sales total \$5,243,500 so far this year, compares with 7,152,500 for the first nine months of 1955.

"The widespread popularity of United States Savings Bonds among our citizens is revealed by their continued purchases of Series E Bonds," said Mr. Harless, who joined with the Savings Bonds Division in expressing thanks for this fine support.

Sunday School Lesson

THE SHEPHERD PSALM

International Sunday School Lesson For October 28, 1956.

Memory Selection: "The Lord is my shepherd, I shall not want."
—Psalm 23:1.

Lesson Text: Psalm 23.

Probably the most familiar of all the Psalms, and perhaps of all the Holy Scriptures, this Shepherd Psalm is one of the most beloved, if not the most treasured of all the treasured passages in God's Word. As Martin Luther once declared, its appeal hinges in the use of the personal pronouns, "I," and "my".

Written by David, the great King of Israel, who, as a boy had cared for his father's sheep on the lonely hills of Bethlehem, it is a beautiful word picture of the relationship which exists between a true shepherd and his sheep. God is pictured as the Shepherd and man as the sheep. Of this relationship, Marvin R. Vincent wrote:

"There is a comforting assurance in the comparison of man to a sheep. For a sheep is not a wild animal... A sheep is an object of purchase, and therefore an object of peculiar care, because he is property; and so man, in accepting the position of a sheep, comes into a peculiarly close relation with...
